

## CONTEMPORARY ISSUES IN BUSINESS REGULATION

**TEACHER:** Professor L. Bai

**CREDITS:** 2 cr.hr.

**PRIMARY BASIS FOR GRADE:** 25-30 page paper and in-class presentation

**PREREQUISITES:** The seminar is open to 2 or 3L students who have completed a course in Corporations and/or with an undergraduate or graduate degree in business, economics, finance. Substantial working experience in the business world is a good substitute for the above course/degree requirement, but the enrollment needs my approval.

**ENROLLMENT:** Limited to 15

**TYPE OF COURSE:** Letter Graded

**COURSE DESCRIPTION:** This is an upper level two-credit seminar on contemporary issues that are prevalent in the regulation of business organizations and activities. The class will meet once each week for about two hours to engage in detailed discussions on topics listed in the syllabus. Except for the first few meetings in which I will provide an overview of the topics, each meeting will be led by a student who has voluntarily signed up as a lead discussant on a topic that he/she has chosen. The student is required to prepare an outline of the discussion before the class. The outline does not have to be perfect but must reflect the student's good faith effort in research. In addition, one or two student will be assigned to comment on the discussion and the outline of the lead student. Comments/suggestions from other participants in the class are also encouraged. The student will write up a paper on the topic that he has presented in class by the end of the semester.
