

# StreetLaw

StreetLaw is a national program of legal instruction designed for law students to teach high-school students. Each law student teaches the StreetLaw curriculum at an area high school during one fifty-minute section three days per week for ten weeks. The curriculum includes introduction to law, family law, consumer law, housing law, torts, and criminal law, with topics in contracts and procedure. The law student then tests and grades the high school students on this material. There is also a weekly classroom component during which the law students learn interactive teaching techniques and the substantive law they will be teaching.

Because the demand for the class may be greater than the current availability, interested students must complete the attached form and submit it to the Registrar along with a copy of a resume.
