II. Assignments

We will cover, on average, 20-25 pages in the casebook per 75-minute class session. You need to read the Code and regulation sections referred to in the casebook assignment and come to class prepared to discuss the problems.

III. eInstruction Handheld Device

I will distribute to you on the first day of class an eInstruction handheld device (or you can stop by my office (Room 421) and pick it up before class on Monday, January 14). You must bring the handheld to class each day and have a spare set of AA batteries if needed. There is no cost for the handheld, but you must turn it in at the end of the course (or you will be assessed a \$100 charge by the Dean's office).
