Health Care Enterprise

Course Description:

This course examines the transactional aspects of health care law. The course first considers how health care services are reimbursed by providing students with an understanding of the complex interaction of private insurance, the federal Medicare program, and the state/federal Medicaid program. The course also provides an analysis of the regulatory schemes regulating the business relationships between health care providers, including fraud & abuse law, Stark II, HIPAA and antitrust laws. In addition, the course provides an overview of the rapidly evolving organizational forms through which health care is delivered, such as integrated delivery systems, physician practice management companies and joint ventures. All issues will be reviewed from a transactional lawyer's perspective and case studies will be used to arrive at practical legal solutions.
